Private Attorneys: If you can afford an attorney, there are many immigration attorneys in the Houston region who are members of the American Immigration Lawyers Association (AILA): www.aialawyer.org.

<p>When you hire an Attorney, ask them questions like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In what state are you licensed? • Have you ever been disciplined by a State Bar? • How long have you practiced immigration law? • What type of immigration law do you specialize in? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ If the individual offering representation avoids your questions, consider finding a different lawyer. ✓ Call multiple attorneys before you hire one. ✓ YOU are the client and you get to decide who will represent your best interests. 	<p>Avoid Notario Fraud</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ A “notario” does not have specialized immigration knowledge or license to practice immigration law. Notarios may cheat you or harm your case. ✓ Be WARY if a provider does any of these: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Asks you to sign blank documents • Refuses to give you a contract for their services • Refuse to show you their license or accreditation • Guarantees positive results • Claims a special relationship to an immigration officer or judge that will benefit your case
